

After solving Puzzles 1 to 6, make sure you record the shapes of the Mysterious Fragments.

If done correctly, Mission 2 will be unlocked.






## Mission 2

n Mission 2, the goal is to uncover the location of the Mysterious Sculpture and identify the one that had vanished.

Perhaps something could be revealed by placing the painting of a full moon and dark clouds inside a frame.

That frame had been in front of your eyes all along — concealed within the Mysterious Fragments. It was what remained after cutting out the square fragment of the Masami Jizō sculpture.




A careful search of the Art Park Center leads you to a key discovery — a poster resting on a table. Printed on it is the very painting in question.

Placing the painting inside the frame reveals the truth — Masami Jizo, the Mysterious Sculpture was hiding inside the Way to the Hidden Garden Cone, and the Vanished Sculpture was **Bee is Going**.










Somewhere inside the Art Park Center lies a brown safe. Your next step is to find it.

If your answer is correct, the safe will unlock and with it, the Final Mission sheet will be revealed.






## Final Mission

The Final Mission is to uncover where the Mysterious Sculpture must be returned.





Now, what sculpture do the numbers 1 and 4 point to?




Think carefully... A red gate-like frame with a silver inverted triangle inside. The answer is — **Different Space**.
